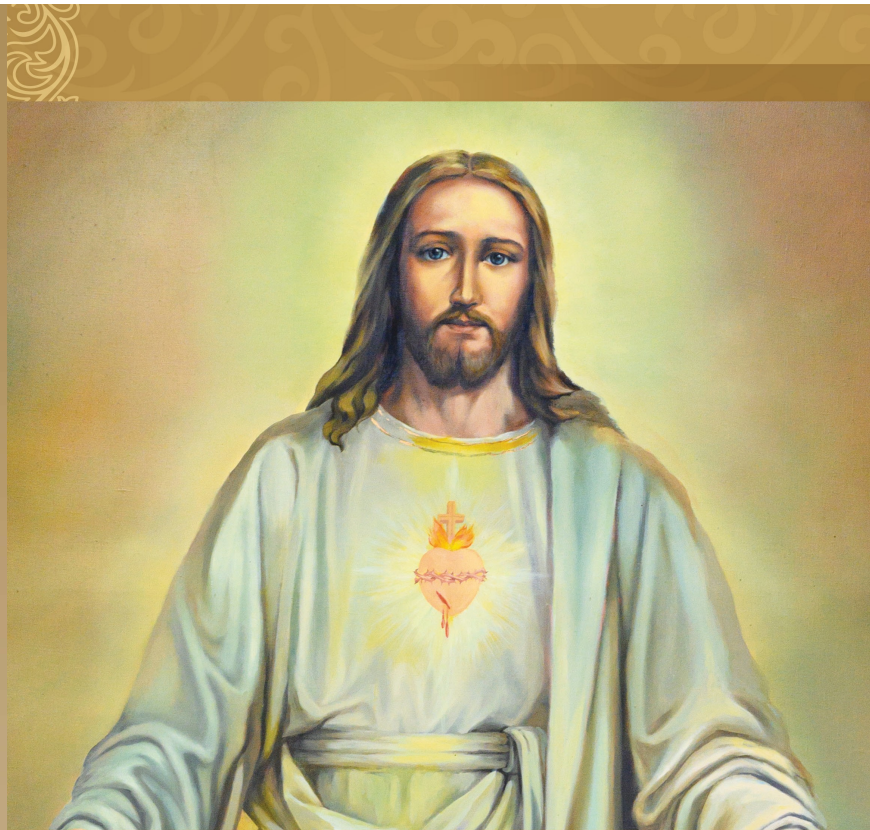

THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

The readings for the last few Sundays have been about the Resurrection, but today's Gospel takes us back in time to an event in Jesus' life before his Passion. Jesus tells his disciples that he is going to prepare a place for them in his Father's house. He promises that where he is going, his disciples will be able to follow. Thomas, who will later doubt the disciples' reports that they have seen the Risen Lord, contradicts Jesus by saying that the disciples don't know where Jesus is going or how to get there. Jesus explains that he himself is the way, the truth, and the life. In knowing and loving Jesus, the disciples now love God the Father.

Philip then makes a request that challenges Jesus' words. Philip wants Jesus to show the Father to the disciples. Recall that Jesus has just told his disciples, "If you know me, then you will also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him." As a good teacher, Jesus responds to Philip by repeating and elaborating on what he has just told the disciples: they have seen and known Jesus, so they have seen and known the Father. Then Jesus offers another reassurance about his departure: because of faith in God and in Jesus, the disciples will do the work that Jesus has done and more. The connection between Jesus and his Father, between Jesus' work and the work of the Father, is made clear in today's Gospel. Jesus is in the Father, and God the Father is in Jesus. As God spoke his name to Moses, "I am," so too Jesus speaks his name to his disciples: "I am the way and the truth and the life."

The revelation of the Trinity is completed in the passage that follows today's reading, and it is the Gospel for next Sunday. Because Jesus goes away, the Father will send in Jesus' name the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who will continue the work of the Father and of Jesus.

We are pleased to welcome Fr. Marc Solomon who will be celebrating Mass with us on Saturday evenings and Msgr. MISSIONARY COOPERATIVE COLLECTION

Our annual collection for the Missionaries will be next weekend, May 9th and 10th. We will have a priest visiting us from the Diocese of Kumbakonam, India. Rev. Selva Raj will be celebrating Mass with us for the Missionary Collection as well as the following weekend of May 16th and 17th.

The Diocese of Kumbakonam tasks itself with providing new Churches to 30 Parishes where the church is not suitable for worship and to provide chapels in 100 mission stations. They provide on-going training and education for 526 Catechists in remote and rural mission stations. They provide home to homeless people and school buildings for the children in remote villages. They educate the children of new converts who face severe religious discrimination and who are forced to abandon Christianity for the sake of educational scholarship, economic benefits like houses, employment and other collateral benefits. These benefits are denied to the new converts to Christianity by the Constitution of India while other converts enjoy these economic benefits.

Relying on God's providence and support and with the co-operation of our people, clergy, religious, friends, well-wishers and generous donors, the Missionaries are confident to carry out their ministry to the best of their ability. Your generous support of their ministry will be greatly appreciated.
